THE USMC CELEBRATES 246 YEARS OF SERVICE TO ITS NATION

ARLINGTON, VA --

On November 10, 2021, Marines across the globe will recognize and acknowledge 246 years of service to their country, the sacrifices made to defend democracy, and the Marine Corps' enduring legacy as America's premier fighting force.

The Marine Corps' annual tradition celebrates the establishment of the organization on November 10, 1775, by the Second Continental Congress. Following their role in the American Revolution, the Marines were abolished following the Treaty of Paris in April 1783. Then, on July 11, 1798, Congress ordered the creation of the Marine Corps and directed that it be available for service under the Secretary of the Navy.


The birthday, also known as Marine Corps Day, was originally celebrated on July 11 from 1799 until 1921 when Major General Lejeune issued an order to formalize the tradition and establish the official day to honor the birthday of the Marine Corps. The ceremony traditionally includes a guest of honor, a reading of Gen. Lejeune's birthday message and the current Commandant's message, recognition of the oldest and youngest Marine present, and a cake cutting.

While the first cake ceremony is unknown, the first on record took place at Marine Barracks, Washington, D.C., in 1937. Major General Thomas Holcomb, the Commandant, presided at an open house for Marine Corps officers, including the cutting of a huge cake in the shape of Tun Tavern, the birthplace of the Corps.





President Jarvis: Recipient of the NAACP's Brooks/Williams Community Service Award

On Veterans Day, November 11, 2021, President Arthur Jarvis was the recipient of the Orange County Branch of the NAACP Brooks/Williams Community Service Award. The Award is named in honor of two former Branch Presidents, Rufus C. Brooks and Willie Williams. Mr. Brooks and Mr. Williams served in the U.S. Military during the Korean War. Mr. Brooks served in the United States Army and Mr. Williams served in the United States Air Force. Following their military service each earned college degrees and became active in Orlando and the Central Florida Community. Mr. Brooks was an educator who firmly believed in the value of an education. He was a classroom teacher and later a principal at various elementary schools in Orange County for more



than 30 years. Mr. Williams began his career as an educator but changed careers and worked as an engineer at Martin Marietta now Lockheed Martin. Mr. Williams was inducted into the Florida Civil Rights Hall of Fame in 2017.

President Jarvis is an example of that commitment to service that characterized the lives of Mr. Brooks and Mr. Williams. For a quarter of a century, President Jarvis has chaired the RAFMAN Foundation Scholarship Banquet. More than

\$85,000 has been raised in this effort by the RAFMAN Club to assist students in need of financial assistance. President Jarvis is a member of the Valencia College Black Advisory Committee and he also serves on the City of Orlando Mayor's Veterans Advisory Committee.

Congratulations President Jarvis.







The Orange County Branch was chartered in 1929, and continues to be a voice for the citizens of Orange County.






The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier



For 100 years, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier has served as the heart of Arlington National Cemetery. As a sacred memorial site and the grave of three unknown American service members, the Tomb connects visitors with the legacy of the United States armed forces throughout the nation's history. It stands as a people's memorial that inspires reflection on service, valor, sacrifice and mourning. Since November 11, 1921, the Tomb has provided a final resting place for one of America's unidentified World War I service members, and Unknowns from later wars were added in 1958 and 1984.



When You Can't Go On

Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed . . . great is [His] faithfulness.—
Lamentations 3:22–23

In 2006, my dad was diagnosed with a neurological disease that robbed him of his memory, speech, and control over body movements. He became bedridden in 2011 and continues to be cared for by my mom at home. The beginning of his illness was a dark time. I was fearful: I knew nothing about caring for a sick person, and I was anxious about finances and my mom's health.

The words of Lamentations 3:22 helped me get up many mornings when the light was as gray as the

state of my heart: "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed." The Hebrew word for "consumed" means "to be used up completely" or "to come to an end."

God's great love enables us to go on, to get up to face the day. Our trials may feel overwhelming, but we won't be destroyed by them because God's love is far greater!

There are many times I can recount when God has shown His faithful, loving ways to my family. I saw His provision in the kindness of relatives and friends, the wise counsel of doctors, financial provision, and the reminder in our hearts that—one day—my dad will be whole again in heaven.

If you're going through a dark time, don't lose hope. God can help you to not be consumed by what you face. Keep trusting in His faithful love and provision for you.—By Karen Huang
